Focused on the artistic traditions inspired by “The Tale of Genji,” known as Japan’s, if not the world’s, first novel written 1,000 years ago, this major Met exhibition will feature more than 120 works, including paintings, calligraphy, silk robes, lacquer wedding set items, a palanquin for the shogun’s bride, and popular art such as ukiyo-e prints and modern manga.
